## Communication and Cognitive Development

- Reciting simple finger plays, rhymes and songs
- Beginning to listen and share with others
- · Communicating feelings and ideas
- Naming body parts
- Grouping items by one attribute
- Solving problems through observation, hands-on, trial and error and repetition
- Identifying colors
- Identifying alphabet letters
- Naming a person, place or thing in a drawing.
- Identifying numbers
- Understanding the concept of more or less
- · Creating simple patterns and complex pattern
- Listening to stories read aloud
- Showing enjoyment of books
- Counting to 5
- One-to-one correspondence

## Fine and Gross Motor Development

- Building simple block structures
- Holding writing utensils with fingers
- Writing first name
- Using scissors with increasing skill
- Drawing some shapes and objects
- Manipulating puzzles, pegs, beads, and other items
- Climbing, running, jumping
- Balancing on one foot
- Throwing and kicking a ball
- Catching a ball
- Responding to music with movement
- Experimenting with multi-sensory items
