Communication and Cognitive Development

- Reciting finger plays, rhymes and songs
- Beginning to rhyme
- Contributing verbally in group discussions
- Speaking articulately

- Repeating and creating simple and complex patterns
- Predicting, observing and drawing conclusions in experiments
- Developing calendar skills (days of the week, months, seasons)

Fine and Gross Motor Development

- Building complex block structures using multiple objects
- Holding writing utensils with correct grip
- Writing first name with upper and lower case letters
- Using scissors with skill
- Drawing shapes and objects
- Pouring liquids
- Working puzzles with 10 or more pieces
- Stringing beads
- Manipulating puzzles, pegs, beads, and other items
- Climbing, running, jumping
- Hopping on one foot
- Throwing and kicking a ball
- Catching a ball
- Galloping and skipping
- Moving body with teacher directions
- Responding to music with movement
- Experimenting with multi-sensory items
